Instill in us a missionary spirit, and let our parish community shine with the light of the Gospel, with prayer and good works, inviting all to share in the divine life, so that Your Name, O Saviour, may be praised, together with Your eternal Father, and your most-holy, good and life-giving Spirit. Amen.

O Archangel Michael, you manifested yourself to be the greatest defender of the thrice-holy Source of Light. Together with the Powers on high, you joyfully call out: Holy are You, O Father. Rejoice with us, all you leaders of the angels; for the great Archangel, your captain and our guardian, appears today in his holy church. He wondrously watches over us and truly sanctifies this place. Therefore, singing his praises daily, let us cry out to him: Keep us safe by the protection of your wings, O great Archangel Michael.

Liturgical Propers:

Troparion (Tone 7): By Your cross You destroyed death; You opened Paradise to the thief; You changed the lamentation of the myrrhbearers to joy, and charged the apostles to proclaim* that You are risen, O Christ our God, offering great mercy to the world.

Troparion (Tone 4): Princes of the heavenly hosts, we, though unworthy, beg you to encircle us through your prayers under the shelter of the wings your spiritual glory. Guard us as we come to you and sincerely cry: Deliver us from dangers, O princes of the powers on high!

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion (Tone 7): No longer shall the dominion of death be able to hold humanity, for Christ went down shattering and destroying it s powers. Hades is bound. The prophets exult with one voice. The Saviour has come for those with faith, saying: "Come forth, O faithful, to the resurrection!"

Kontakion (Tone 2): Princes of God's hosts, ministers of divine glory, leaders of angels and guides of men, pray for our welfare and for great mercy, O princes of the incorporeal powers.

Prokeimenon (Tone 7): The Lord will give strength to His people; the Lord will bless His people with peace.

Verse: Bring to the Lord, O you sons of God; bring to the Lord young rams (Ps. 28:11)

Prokeimenon (Tone 4): He makes spirits His angels and flaming fire His ministers. (Ps. 103:4)

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Hebrews: (Heb. 2:2-10)

Brothers and Sisters, if the message declared through angels was valid, and every transgression or disobedience received a just penalty, how can we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? It was declared at first through the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard him, while God added his testimony by signs and wonders and various miracles, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit, distributed according to his will. Now God did not subject the coming world,

about which we are speaking, to angels. But someone has testified somewhere, "What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them? You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honour, subjecting all things under their feet." Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, but we do see



Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honour because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings.

Alleluia (Tone 7): It is good to give praise to the Lord; and to sing to Your name, O Most High (Ps. 91:2) To announce Your mercy in the morning, and Your truth every night. (Ps. 91:3). Praise the Lord, all you His angels; praise Him, all you powers (Ps 148:2). For He spoke and they came into being; He commanded and they were created (Ps 148:5).

Gospel: (Luke 10: 16-21)

The Lord said to his disciples, "Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the One who sent me." The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" He said to them, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven." At that same hour Jesus rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will."

Communion Verses: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest (Ps 148:1). He makes spirits His angels, and flaming fire His ministers (Ps. 104:4). Alleluia! (3x)

Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

SPIRITUAL READINGS

The Synaxis of the Chief of the Heavenly Hosts, Archangel Michael and the Other Heavenly Bodiless Powers: Archangels Gabriel, Raphael, Uriel, Selaphiel, Jehudiel, Barachiel, and Jeremiel was established at the beginning of the fourth century at the Council of Laodicea, which met several years before the First Ecumenical Council. The 35th Canon of the Council of Laodicea condemned and denounced as heretical the worship of angels as gods

and rulers of the world, but affirmed their proper veneration. A Feastday was established in November, the ninth month after March (with which the year began in ancient times) since there are Nine Ranks of Angels. The eighth day of the month was chosen for the Synaxis of all the Bodiless Powers of Heaven since the Day of the Dread Last Judgment is called the Eighth Day by the holy Fathers. After the end of this age (characterized by its seven days of Creation) will come the Eighth Day, and then "the Son of Man shall come in His Glory and all the holy Angels with Him" (Mt. 25:31).

The Angelic Ranks are divided into three Hierarchies: highest, middle, and lowest.

The Highest Hierarchy includes: the Seraphim, Cherubim and Thrones.

The six-winged SERAPHIM (Flaming, Fiery) (Is 6:12) stand closest of all to the Most Holy Trinity. They blaze with love for God and kindle such love in others.

The many-eyed CHERUBIM (outpouring of wisdom, enlightenment) (Gen 3:24) stand before the Lord after the Seraphim. They are radiant with the light of knowledge of God, and knowledge of the mysteries of God. Through them wisdom is poured forth, and people's minds are enlightened so they may know God and behold His glory.

The THRONES (Col 1:16) stand after the Cherubim, mysteriously and incomprehensibly bearing God through the grace given them for their service. They are ministers of God's justice, giving to tribunals, kings, etc. The capacity for righteous judgment.

The Middle Angelic Hierarchy consists of three Ranks: Dominions, Powers, and Authorities:

DOMINIONS (Col 1:16) hold dominion over the angels subject to them. They instruct the earthly authorities, established by God, to rule wisely, and to govern their lands well. The Dominions teach us to subdue sinful impulses, to subject the flesh to the spirit, to master our will, and to conquer temptation.

POWERS (1 Pet 3:22) fulfill the will of God without hesitation. They work great miracles and give the grace of wonderworking and clairvoyance to saints pleasing to God. The Powers assist people in fulfilling obedience. They also encourage them to be patient, and give them spiritual strength and fortitude.

AUTHORITIES (1 Pet 3:22, Col 1:16) have authority over the devil. They protect people from demonic temptations, and prevent demons from harming people as they would wish. They also uphold ascetics and guard them, helping people in the struggle with evil thoughts.

The Lowest Hierarchy includes the three Ranks: Principalities, Archangels, and Angels:

PRINIPALITIES (Col 1:16) have command over the lower angels, instructing them in the fulfilling of God's commands. They watch over the world and protect lands, nations and peoples. Principalities instruct people to render proper honor to those in authority, as befits their station. They teach those in authority to use their position, not for personal glory and gain, but to honor God, and to spread word of Him, for the benefit of those under them.

ARCHANGELS (1 Thess 4:16) are messengers of great and wondrous tidings. They reveal prophecies and the mysteries of the faith. They enlighten people to know and understand the will of God, they spread faith in God among the people, illuminating their minds with the light of the Holy Gospel.

ANGELS (1 Pet 3:22) are in the lowest rank of the heavenly hierarchy, and closest to people. They reveal the lesser mysteries of God and His intentions, guiding people to virtuous and holy life. They support those who remain steadfast, and they raise up the fallen. They never abandon us and they are always prepared to help us, if we desire it. All the Ranks of the Heavenly Powers are called angels, although each has its own name and position by virtue of their service. The Lord reveals His will to the highest ranks of the angels, and they in turn inform the others.

Over all the Nine Ranks, the Lord appointed the Holy Archangel Michael (his name in Hebrew means "who is like unto God"), the faithful servitor of God, as Chief Commander. He cast down from Heaven the arrogantly proud Lucifer and the other fallen spirits when they rebelled against God. Michael summoned the ranks of angels and cried out, "Let us attend! Let us stand aright before our Creator and do not consider doing what is displeasing unto God!"

According to Church Tradition, and in the church services to the Archangel Michael, he participated in many other Old Testament events.

During the Exodus of the Israelites from Egypt he went before them in the form of a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. Through him the power of the Lord was made manifest, annihilating the Egyptians and Pharaoh who were in pursuit of the Israelites. The Archangel Michael defended Israel in all its misfortunes. He appeared to Joshua Son of Navi and revealed the will of the Lord at the taking of Jericho (*Joshua 5:13-16*).

The power of the great Chief Commander of God was manifest in the annihilation of the 185 thousand soldiers of the Assyrian emperor Sennacherib (2 Kings 19:35); also in the smiting of the impious leader Heliodorus (2 Macc. 3: 24-26); and in the protection of the Three Holy Youths: Ananias, Azarias and Misail, thrown into the fiery furnace for their refusal to worship an idol (Dan 3:22-25).

Through the will of God, the Chief Commander Michael transported the Prophet Habbakuk (*December 2*) from Judea to Babylon, to give food to Daniel in the lions' den (*Dan. 14:33-37*).

The Archangel Michael disputed with the devil over the body of the holy Prophet Moses (*Jude 1:9*). The holy Archangel Michael showed his power when he miraculously saved a young man, cast into the sea by robbers with a stone about his neck on the shores of Mount Athos. This story is found in the Athonite Paterikon, and in the Life of Saint Neophytus of Docheiariou (*November 9*).

Gabriel: strength (power) of God, herald and servitor of Divine omnipotence (*Dan 8:16, Luke 1:26*). He announces the mysteries of God. Raphael: the healing of God, the curer of human infirmities (*Tobit 3:16, 12:15*)

Uriel: the fire or light of God, enlightener (3 Ezdras 5:20). We pray for him to enlighten those with darkened minds.

Selaphiel: the prayer of God, impelling to prayer (3 Ezdras 5:16). He prays to God for mankind. Jehudiel: the glorifying of God, encouraging exertion for the glory of the Lord and interceding for the reward of efforts.

Barachiel: distributor of the blessings of God for good deeds, entreats the mercy of God for people. Jeremiel: the raising up to God (3 Ezdras 4:36)

On icons the Archangels are depicted in according to the character of their service:

Michael tramples the devil underfoot, and in his left hand holds a green date-tree branch, and in his right hand a spear with a white banner (or sometimes a fiery sword), on which is outlined a scarlet cross.

Gabriel with a branch from Paradise, presented by him to the Most Holy Virgin, or with a shining lantern in his right hand and with a mirror made of jasper in his left.

Raphael holds a vessel with healing medications in his left hand, and with his right hand leads Tobias, carrying a fish for healing (*Tobit 5-8*).

Uriel in his raised right hand holds a naked sword at the level of his chest, and in his lowered left hand "a fiery flame."

Selaphiel in a prayerful posture, gazing downwards, hands folded on the chest.

Jehudiel holds a golden crown in his right hand, in his left, a whip of three red (or black) thongs.

Barachiel is shown with a white rose on his breast.

Jeremiel holds balance-scales in his hand.

Each person has a guardian angel, and every nation also receives its own guardian angel from God (Dan. 10:13). When a church is consecrated, it also receives a guardian angel (Palladius, Dial. Ch. 10).

New Ukrainian Metropolitan of Poland

It is announced today (on Saturday, Nov. 7th) from the Vatican that Auxiliary-bishop Popovych has been named Metropolitan of Przemysl for Ukrainians in Poland:

His Excellency Kyr Yevhen Myroslav Popovych (Eugeniusz Mirosław Popowicz) was born on 12 October 1961 in Człuchów, in the Province of Pomerania, Poland. After completing high school in 1981 he entered the Lublin Major Seminary and was ordained a priest on 17 October 1986 in Stargard Szczeciński, Poland, by Archbishop Myroslav Marusyn, Secretary of the Congregation for the Eastern Churches.

After this ordination he was entrusted with the following offices and esponsibilities: curate of Elblag and Pasłęk; judicial vicar and professor at the

Greek-Catholic Seminaries of Lviv and Ternopil and the Theological Academy (which later became the Ukrainian Catholic University) in Lviv (Ukraine); episcopal vicar and parish priest of Górowo Iławeckie and Lelkowo; professor at the Major Seminary of the Basilian Order in Przemyśl; member of the presbyteral council, the college of consulters, and of the financial council of the Archparchy of Przemyśl-Warszawa.

In 1988 he received a bachelors in theology from the Catholic University of Lublin. Subsequently from 1988 to 1993, he studied at the Pontifical Oriental Institute in Rome, where he received a doctorate in Oriental Canon Law.

From 1996 to 2013 he fulfilled the office of parish priest of the Ukrainian Greek-Catholic Cathedral of Przemyśl and Protosyncellus (Vicar General) of the Archeparchy, and was made a mitred archpriest. He was made a canon of the Cathedral Chapter and later became the archpriest (provost) of the chapter.

His years as vicar general enabled Kyr Yehven to gain a wide knowledge and experience in pastoral work. In his sermons he touched on the following themes: that evangelization and catechesis were the foremost necessities in the Church, which must provide pastoral sacramental-liturgical care based on Holy Confession and the Blessed Euchatist. The archeparchial curia entrusted him with organizing parish retreats and pastoral-social assistance initiatives for the needy, for which he organized various welfare associations.

Named Auxiliiary-bishop of the Archeparchy of Przemyśl-Warszawa on 4 November 2013, Bishop-elect Myroslav concelebrated the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy at the Papal Altar in the Vatican Basilica of St. Peter's, after which was presented by Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk to Pope Francis.

He received the episcopal ordination on 21 December 2013, at the hands of Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk, with Metropolitan Ivan Martynyak of Przemyśl-Warszawa, and Bishop Volodymyr Yushcak (Juszczak) of Gdansk-Wroclaw co-consecrating.

He knows Polish, Ukrainian, Italian, Russian, and English. Source: Vatican Information Service, Wikipedia

Patriarchal Divine Liturgy for Holodomor Monument Dedication

Patriarch Sviatoslav began his pastoral visit to the United States to participate in the solemn dedication of the new monument commemorating the Ukrainian Famine on Thursday afternoon with his arrival to Dulles International airport.

Metropolitan Stefan Soroka, Archbishop of Philadelphia, welcomed him at a dinner held at St. Josaphat Seminary later that evening.

On Friday morning, Patirarch Sviatoslav celebrated the Divine Liturgy in the chapel of St. Josaphat Seminary. He was joined by Metropolitan Stefan Soroka; Bishop John Bura, auxiliary bishop of Philadelphia; Fr. Robert Hitchens, rector; Fr. Wasyl Kharuk, spiritual director, Fr. Mark Morozowich, dean of the School of Theology at the Catholic University of America; Fr. Raphael Strontsitskyy MSU, graduate studies at Catholic University; Fr. Roman Sverdan, personal assistant to the Metropolitan; and Fr. Vsevolod Shevchuk, pastor of Holy Ghost, Akron, Ohio. The liturgy was sung by the seminarians.

Later in the evening, Patriarch Sviatoslav attended the opening of the Ukrainian Famine/Holodomor Exhibit to officially begin the US observances commemorating the Famine.

St. Josaphat seminary was founded in September 1941 and serves all four eparchies in the USA. Since then, it has trained many priests who have served in the United States, Canada, and Ukraine. Some were chosen as bishops and have served our church in the United States and Ukraine. Among them are Cardinal Husar and the current Metropolitan of the USA, Archbishop Stefan Soroka, as well as, Bishop Richard Seminack, Bishop Bohdan Danylo, and Bishop John Bura.

This year there are seven seminarians studying at St. Josaphat Seminary. The seminarians come from various regions of the USA, some other countries and from diverse ethnic backgrounds. One seminarian was born in Ukraine, one was born in Mexico, one is from Brazil, one is from California, two are from Arizona, two are from Pennsylvania, and one is from New Jersey.

The Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States attracts faithful people from different races, ethnicities, and even other faith traditions. St. Josaphat Seminary has the mission to prepare men who will serve as priests in a Church that not only has people from Ukraine or descendants of those from Ukraine, but also has people who come from many places around the world. Just as our Ukrainian Catholic Church is a "Global Church" so too is the composition of the faithful of our Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States in many parishes across the country.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion:

- 1. You are a member of the Catholic Church (Orthodox faithful are welcome to receive Holy Communion);
- 2. You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently;
- 3. You attend Divine Services regularly;
- 4. Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church;
- 5. You have kept the Liturgical fast no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast).
- 6. You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel.
- 7. To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace.

If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

N.B. a reminder about appropriate reception of Holy Communion - when approaching to receive the Holy Eucharist, the faithful are reminded to open their mouth wide and tilt their head back.

Bequests and Wills: Leaving a bequest is a process of giving a donation through your will. It is simply a distribution from your estate to a charitable organization through your last will and testament. It can be as small or as large a donation as you wish. It is important that you talk to your lawyer about the process.
