Third Antiphon

Epistle (for Sunday): A reading from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians: (1 Cor. 15:1-11)

Brethren, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and in which you stand firm. You are being saved by it at this very moment if you hold fast to it as I preached it to you. Otherwise you have believed in vain. I handed on to you first of all what I myself received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried and, in accordance with the Scriptures, rose on the third day; that he was seen by Cephas (Se-fas), that by the Twelve. After that he was seen by five hundred brothers at once, most of whom are still alive, although some have fallen asleep. Next he was seen by James; that by all the apostles. Last of all was seen by me, as one born out of the normal course. I am the least of the apostles; in fact, because I persecuted the church of God, I do not even deserve the name. But by God's favor I am what I am. This favor of His to me has not proved fruitless. Indeed, I have worked harder than all the other, not on my own but through the favor of God. In any case, whether it be I or they, this is what we preach and this is what you believed.



Epistle (for Transfiguration of ICXP): A reading of the 2nd Epistle of Saint Peter (2 Peter 1:10-19)

Brethren, be all the more eager to make your call and election firm, for, in doing so, you will never stumble. For, in this way, entry into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ will be richly provided for you. Therefore, I will always remind you of these things, even though you already know them and are established in the truth you have. I think it right, as long as I am in this "tent," to stir you up by a reminder, since I know that I will soon have to put it aside, as indeed our Lord Jesus Christ has shown me. I shall also make every effort to enable you always to remember these things after my departure. We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that unique declaration came to him from the majestic glory, "This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven while we were with him on the holy mountain. Moreover, we possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable. You will do well to be attentive to it, as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

Alleluia (Tone 3): In You, O Lord, have I hoped that I may not be put to shame for ever (Ps 30:2). Be a protector unto me, O God, and a house of refuge to save me (Ps 30:3).

Gospel (for Sunday): (Mt 19:16-26)

At that time, a young man came up to Jesus and said, "Teacher, what good must I do to possess everlasting life?" He answered, "Why do you question me about what is good? There is One who is good. If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." "Which ones?" he asked. Jesus replied, "'You shall not kill;' 'You shall not commit adultery;' 'You shall not steal;' 'You shall not bear false witness;' 'Honor your father and your mother;' and 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" The young man said to him, "I have kept all these; what do I need to do further?" Jesus told him, "If you seek perfection, go, sell your possessions, and give to the poor. You will then have treasure in heaven. Afterward come back and follow me." Hearing these words, the young man went away sad, for his possessions were many. Jesus said to his disciples: "I assure you, only with difficulty will a rich man enter into the kingdom of God. I repeat what I said: it is easier for a camel to pass through a needle's eye than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this they were completely overwhelmed, and exclaimed, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For man it is impossible; but for God all things are possible."



Gospel (for Transfiguration of ICXP): (Matthew 17:1-9)

At that time Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will

make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

Instead of "It is truly...": O my soul, magnify the Lord transfigured on the mountain.

Irmos (Tone 4): Your giving birth was revealed as incorrupt; for it was God who came forth from your womb; He appeared on earth in the flesh, and made His dwelling among us. Thus, O Mother of God, all of us magnify you.

Communion Verses: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest (*Ps 148:1*). We will walk in the light of Your face, O Lord, and rejoice in Your name forever (*Ps 88:16-17*). Alleluia! (x3)

Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. **For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.**

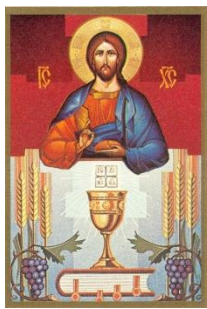

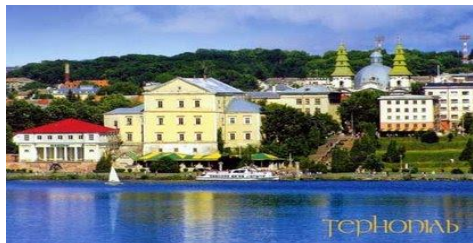

Pope at WYD Mass says mercy matters more than fashions

Over a million and a half young people from across the globe gathered on the outskirts of Krakow on Sunday morning for the final mass of World Youth Day. The celebration, led by Pope Francis, culminated in the announcement of the venue for the next event, scheduled to take place in 2019. During the Mass, the Pope told the young people that each one of them is precious and valued by God, who doesn't care what clothes they wear or what kind of cell phone they use. He urged them to be courageous and to share God's love with others, as our correspondent in Krakow, Lydia O'Kane reports....

As the sun came up at the Campus Misericordia on Sunday morning the many thousands of pilgrims who had remained in these grounds overnight prepared themselves for the final Mass of this World Youth Day.

Pope Francis was entering this camp for the second time in 24 hours, and as he travelled through this field greeting the sea of youth, the Israeli singer Noah gave a rendition of the Ave Verum and the Ave Maria.

Following an intense week of prayer, reflection and events the Holy Father made his way to the altar for the last time here in Krakow, bathed in the glorious image of Jesus, Divine Mercy. The patrons of this World Youth Day, and symbols of God's mercy, St John Paul II and St Faustina Kowalska were also remembered.

The Pope's homily at this closing Mass was one of encouragement to the hundreds of thousands of young people who had come from all over the world for this event. He told them that "no one is insignificant. God counts on you for what you are, not for what you possess."

The Pope explained to them that, their real stature was their spiritual identity. "At times in our lives, we aim lower rather than higher", the Holy Father noted, but God is always "cheering us on; he is our biggest fan."

Pope Francis urged the young pilgrims here to be courageous, not to be afraid to take risks, not to be discouraged "if people laugh because they believe in the gentle and unassuming power of mercy."

The Pope concluded his homily with this message, "World Youth Day begins today and continues tomorrow, in your homes, since that is where Jesus wants to meet you from now on."

And then it was time for one of the highpoints of this celebration, the announcement of the venue for the next World Youth Day. With joy, the Holy Father revealed that this 2019 youth meeting would take place in Panama with these words, "the providence of God always precedes us. Just think that it has already decided the next milestone in the great pilgrimage started in 1985 by Saint John Paul II. And therefore I announce with joy that the next World Youth Day - after the two diocesan ones - will be in 2019 in Panama City!

It was then left to the next host of this event to lead the festivities, which they did in style. Panama pilgrims along with the country's president erupted with joy and cheering and the country's distinctive blue, white and red starred flag took pride of place on the stage here at the Campus Misericordiae. As Panama fever took hold Bishops and nuns danced with pilgrims, as the youth of



this country invited their fellow participants to join them there in three years' time to celebrate their faith and be witnesses to Christ's love.

Pope Francis' message for Rio Olympics: 'fight the good fight'

At the conclusion of his Wednesday General Audience, Pope Francis delivered his message for the upcoming **Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro**, urging Brazilians to work for a more just and safe country.

With the Olympic Games 2016 getting underway in Rio on Saturday, August 6th, Pope Francis told all those involved to 'fight the good fight' and finish the race together. He said "in a world thirsting for peace, tolerance, and reconciliation", the prize for all participants and spectators of the Games consisted in something much more precious than a medal.

Their prize, he said, is "the construction of a civilization in which solidarity reigns and is based upon the recognition that we are all members of the same human family, regardless of the differences of culture, skin color, or religion."

The Holy Father also expressed his desire that all Brazilians, "who with their joy and characteristic hospitality have organized the 'Feast of Sport', ... that this will be an opportunity to overcome difficult moments and commit themselves to working as a team to build a more just and safe country, betting all on a future full of hope and joy."

A Vatican Radio English translation of Pope Francis' message for the Olympics is below:

I would like to send an especially warm greeting to the Brazilian people, in particular to the city of Rio de Janeiro, which is hosting the athletes and passionate fans from all over the world on the occasion of the Olympics. In a world thirsting for peace, tolerance, and reconciliation, I hope that the spirit of the Olympic Games inspires all – participants and spectators – to "fight the good fight" and finish the race together (cf. 2 Tim 4,7-8), desiring to obtain as a prize, not a medal, but something much more precious: the construction of a civilization in which solidarity reigns and is based upon the recognition that we are all members of the same human family, regardless of the differences of culture, skin color, or religion. And for all Brazilians, who with their joy and characteristic hospitality have organized the 'Feast of Sport', I hope that this will be an opportunity to overcome difficult moments and commit themselves to working as a team to build a more just and safe country, betting all on a future full of hope and joy. May God bless you all!

If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.
