



THE VIBRANT PARISH - A PLACE TO ENCOUNTER THE LIVING CHRIST: Through the Word, the Holy Mysteries & Prayer, Serving One's Neighbour, Leadership, Fostering & Serving Unity and Missionary Spirit – Pastoral Letter of His Beatitude Sviatoslav

O Lord Jesus Christ, our Good Shepherd, as you once gathered lost sheep that they might hear Your voice and be your



flock, so also today graciously look down from heaven upon our parish community, and send down on it your Holy Spirit, that it might be a place to receive the joy of Your Good News. Strengthen us with your presence, and always gather us together in prayer. Grant us the spirit of serving others, so that in our parish all might encounter You, the merciful God. Bless our spiritual leaders with Your wisdom, and inspire us to generously give of our time, talents and treasure for the building up of Your Kingdom. Unite us in peace and harmony, as befits Your community of love. Instill in us a missionary spirit, and let our parish community shine with the light of the Gospel, with prayer and good works, inviting all to share in the divine life, so that Your Name, O Saviour, may be praised, together with Your eternal Father, and your most-holy, good and life-giving Spirit. Amen.

There is exists in Christian tradition a wisdom regarding how to live the Gospel. This wisdom reminds us that the purely literal reading of Scripture may not be enough for us to know how to live. Today's Gospel lesson of the Good Samaritan tells us to go and imitate the Good Samaritan - be neighbourly to those we meet in our daily life, even if they are strangers or enemies.

"Let us not hurry past so pitiable a sight without taking pity. Even if others do so, you must not. Do not say to yourself: 'I am no priest or monk... This is a work for the priests; this is work for the monks.' The Samaritan did not say: 'Where are the priests now? Where are the Pharisees now? Where are the teachers of the Jews?'... Therefore, when you see someone in need of treatment for some ailment of the body or soul, do not say to yourself: 'Why did so-and-so or so-and-so not take

care of mine if ou nee min from its sickness, do not demand an accounting from others for their negligence. Tell me this. If you find a gold coin lying on the ground, do you say to yourself: 'Why didn't so-and-so pick it up?' Do you not rush to snatch it up before somebody else does? Think the same way about your fallen brothers; consider that tending his wounds is like finding a treasure. If you pour the word of instruction on his wounds like oil, if you bind them up with your mildness, and cure them with your patience, your wounded brother has made you a richer man that any treasure could. Jeremiah said: 'He who has brought forth the precious from the vile will be as my mouth.' What could we compare to that? No fasting, no sleeping on the ground, no watching and praying all night, nor anything else can do as much for you as saving your brother can accomplish."

Gospel: (Luke 10: 25-37)

At that time a lawyer stood up to pose Jesus, this problem: "Teacher, what must I do to inherit everlasting life?" Jesus answered him: "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He replied: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." Jesus said, "You have answered correctly. Do this and you shall live."

But because he wished to justify himself he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied: "There was a man going down from Jerusalem to Jericho who fell prey to robbers. They stripped him, beat him, and then went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road; he saw him but continued on. Likewise there was a Levite who came the same way; he saw him and went on. But a Samaritan who was journeying along came on him and was moved to pity at the sight. He approached him and dressed his wounds, pouring in oil and wine. He then hoisted him on his own beast and brought him to an inn, where he cared for him. The next day he took out two silver pieces and gave them to the innkeeper with the request: 'Look after him, and if there is any further expense I will repay you on my way back.'

"Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the man who fell in with the robbers?" The answer came, "The one who treated him with compassion." Jesus said to him, "Then go and do the same."

Our Eparch, Bishop Ken is requesting that at the conclusion of every Divine Liturgy we say an additional prayer for Peace in Ukraine until the end of the war. For peace in Ukraine, let us pray: Our Father ... Hail Mary ... Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Please, remember to take a few moments of silence and prayer on this coming Friday of November 11th to remember those who gave their lives in the defense of freedom and human dignity in Canada and Ukraine! Please check your local papers for times of commemoration services in

your area. Vichnaya Pamyat'-Eternal Memory!



Head of UGCC: "Ukraine needs an educational reform to democratize an education itself"

An educational reform is one of the reforms Ukraine is of a great need. First of all we need it in order to democratize an education. Besides, it is vital for improving conditions of activity, especially when it comes to catholic schools. Such position was

adopted by Father and Head of Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church His Beatitude Sviatoslav, October 28, 2016 during the 88th General Assembly of the European Committee for Catholic Education in Ukraine.

Discussing a development of private education in Ukraine, Head of Church mentioned that within Ukrainian law practice there are two forms of property – state and private. Private was being entirely financed by a holder. That is why an amount of private (especially the ones found by religious organizations) education institutions makes only one percent out of its general amount (number of students there is equal to general number), private kindergartens, respectively, 1 and 8 percent (number of children under school age – one percent out of general number).

According to the Major Archbishop, after a long-term cooperation between different Churches and Ukrainian deputies (present Minister of education Lilia Hrynevych, in particular) finally, in 2015 it was succeeded to implement a law of Ukraine "About making amendments to some laws of Ukraine regarding an establishment of educational institutions by religious organizations", which gave religious organizations a right to establish educational institutions of different levels.

"A special feature of establishing Christian education in Ukraine was that this process became a ground of appearing a fruitful interconfessional dialogue in our country. A necessity to establish appropriate conditions for a Christian youth's upbringing has united Ukrainian Christian confessions with a common aim. Despite a fact that this aim has activated a dialogue between Church and state, indicating on places where Church and state have common interests and perspective of cooperation", His Beatitude Sviatoslav assumes.

Head of Church said that the leading role in a process of forming an interconfessional dialogue and system of state-church relationships in modern Ukraine occupies All-Ukrainian Council of Churches and Religious Organizations.

Please, contact Fr. Pavlo if you want to have the Divine Liturgies celebrated in your special (such as: In thanksgiving for favours received, the Infirm, General Intentions, the Deceased, Help of the Holy Spirit, for the Travelers, etc.) intentions.

Pastoral Ministry and Sacraments: Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Liturgies and other days, by appointment.

Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time. Baptisms: by appointment. Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. Funerals and Memorials: by appointment. Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing or to meet with parish priest, please call or email Fr. Pavlo in advance to arrange a time and a day.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion:

You are a member of the Catholic Church (Orthodox faithful are welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

Bequests and Wills: Leaving a bequest is a process of giving a donation through your will. It is simply a distribution from your estate to a charitable organization through your last will and testament. It can be as small or as large a donation as you wish. It is important that you talk to your lawyer about the process.
