Bless our spiritual leaders with Your wisdom, and inspire us to generously give of our time, talents and treasure for the building up of Your Kingdom. Unite us in peace and harmony, as befits Your community of love. Instill in us a missionary spirit, and let our parish community shine with the light of the Gospel, with prayer and good works, inviting all to share in the divine life, so that Your Name, O Saviour, may be praised, together with Your eternal Father, and your most-holy, good and life-giving Spirit. Amen.

“For that the centurion was not a Jew is evident, both from his being a centurion and from its being said, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. And it was a very great thing for a man who was out of the list of the Jewish people to admit so great a thought. For he did no less than imagine to himself, as it seems to me, the armies in Heaven; or that the diseases and death, and everything else, were so subject to Him, as his soldiers to himself.

Wherefore he said likewise, for I also am a man set under authority; that is, You are God, and I man; I under authority, but Thou not under authority. If I therefore, being a man, and under authority, can do so much; far more He, both as God, and as not under authority. Thus with the strongest expression he desires to convince Him, that he says this, as one giving not a similar example, but one far exceeding.” - *Saint John Chrysostom*

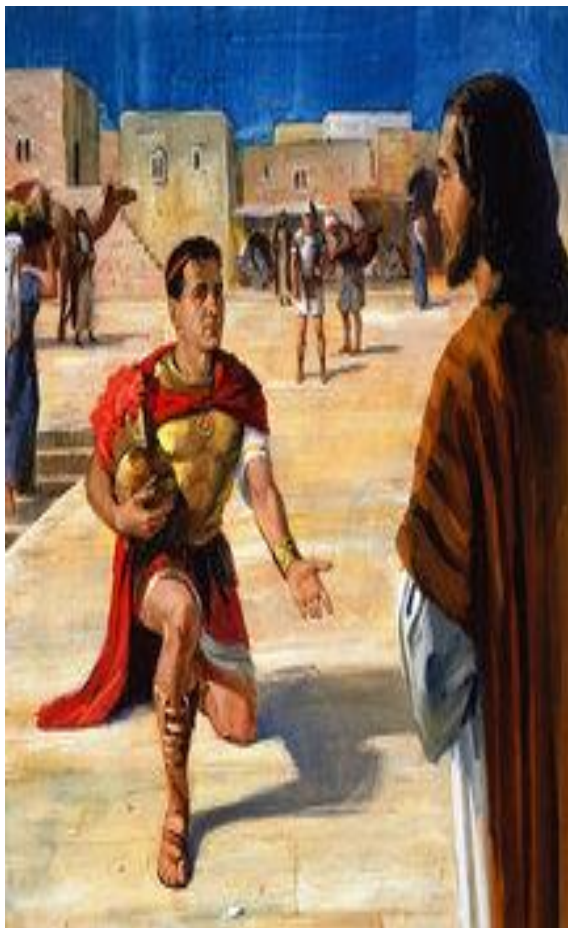

Text from “The Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom: An Anthology for Worship”; Pg. 581

Troparion (Tone 3): Let the heavens be glad, let the earth rejoice, for the Lord has done a mighty deed with his arm. He trampled death by death; He became the first born of the dead; He saved us from the abyss of Hades and granted great mercy to the world.



Troparion (Tone 4): O you, who glorified Christ: princes and bishops, monastics and martyrs, and steadfast confessors of Christian Ukraine throughout all times, pray Christ God to look with favour on our people and to grant them the grace to persevere in the faith that the souls of prayerful faithful who revere your sacred memory may be saved.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit:

Kontakion (Tone 4): You shine as bright beacons, O God-inspired and righteous saints of our Church. By your encouraging example you serve communities of faithful throughout the Christian world. Therefore we humbly bow our heads to you thanking our great and all-gracious God, Who has made you our intercessors in heaven, where you pray for our souls.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion (Tone 3): Today the Virgin stands before us in the church, and together with the choirs of saints invisibly prays to God for us. Angels are worshiping with hierarchs; apostles exalt with prophets, for the Mother of God prays in our behalf to the eternal God.

Prokimenon (Tone 3): Sing to our God, sing; sing to our King, sing (Ps 46:7).

Verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous (Ps 32:1).

Prokimenon (Tone 7): Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His venerable ones (Ps 115:6).

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans: (Rom. 6:18-23)

Brethren, freed from your sin, you became slaves of justice. (I use following example from human affairs because of your weak human nature.) Just as formerly you enslaved your bodies to impurity and licentiousness for their degradation; make them now the servants of justice for their sanctification. When you were slaves of sin, you had freedom from justice. What benefit did you then enjoy? Things you are now ashamed of, all of them tending toward death. But now that you are freed from sin and have become slaves of God, your benefit is sanctification as you tend toward eternal life. The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Alleluia (Tone 3): In You, O Lord, have I hoped that I may not be put to shame for ever (Ps 30:2). Be a protector unto me, O God, and a house of refuge to save me (Ps 30:3). Blessed is the man who fears the Lord; he shall delight exceedingly in His commandments (Ps 111:1).

Gospel: (Matthew 8:5-13)

At that time, as Jesus entered Capernaum, a centurion approached him, with this request: 'Sir, my serving boy is at home in bed paralyzed, suffering painfully.' He said to him, 'I will come and cure him.' 'Sir,' the centurion said in reply, 'I am not worthy to have you under my roof. Just give an order and my boy will get better. I am a man under authority myself and I have troops assigned me. If I give one man the order, "Dismissed", off he goes. If I say to another, "Come here," he comes. If I tell my slave, "Do this", he does it.' Jesus showed amazement on hearing this and remarked to his followers, 'I assure you, I have never found this much faith in Israel. Mark what I say! Many will come from the east and the west and will find a place at the banquet in the kingdom of God with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. While the natural heirs of the kingdom will be driven out into the dark. Wailing will be heard there, and the grinding of teeth.' To the centurion Jesus said, 'Go home. It shall be done because you trusted.' That very moment the boy got better.

Communion Verses: Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest (Ps 148:1). Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous (Ps 32:1). Alleluia! (x3)

Pope Francis: How to hear the voice of Jesus

To hear the Lord's voice, we have to become little, Pope Francis said on Friday, as the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The pope's words came during his homily at Holy Mass in the Chapel of his residence at Santa Marta.

Reflecting on today's First Reading from Deuteronomy (7:6-11) — in which Moses tells the people that God has chosen them “to be a people for his own possession, out of all the peoples that are on the face of the earth” — Pope Francis that on this feast of the Sacred Heart, God “gives us the grace of celebrating with joy the great mysteries of our salvation, of His love for us.”

The pope reflected on two particular words from today's First Reading: *chosen* and *littleness*.

Chosen

Regarding the first, the pope said it is not we who have “chosen Him” but rather God who has made himself “our prisoner”: *“He has bound himself to our lives; he cannot leave. He played hard! And he remains faithful in this attitude. We have been chosen for love and this is our identity. ‘I have chosen this religion; I have chosen ...’: no, you did not choose. He is the One who has chosen you. He has called you and bound himself to you. And this is our faith. If we do not believe this, then we do not understand the message of Christ; we do not understand the Gospel.”*

Littleness

Regarding the second word — *littleness* — Pope Francis recalled how Moses specified that the Lord had set his love upon the people of Israel and chose them because they were “the fewest (smallest) of all peoples.” (Deut. 7: 6-7):

“He fell in love with our littleness, and that is why he has chosen us. He chooses the little: not the great ones, but the little ones. And he revealed himself to the little ones: ‘You have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed

them to babes' (Mt 11:25). He reveals himself to those who are little. If you want to understand something of the mystery of Jesus, lower yourself, make yourself small. Recognize that you are nothing. And he does not only reveal himself to little ones, but he calls the little ones:

'Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.' You who are the littlest — through suffering, through weariness ... He chooses the little ones; he reveals himself to little ones, he calls the little ones. But does He not call the great ones? His heart is open, but the the great ones cannot hear his voice because they are too full of themselves. To hear the voice of the Lord, you have to become small.'

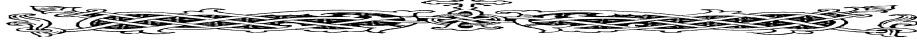
Thus do we arrive at the mystery of the Heart of Christ, which is not, as "some say" a "little image" for the devout, Pope Francis said. The pierced Heart of Christ is "the heart of revelation, the heart of our faith because He became little; he chose this way." In other words, he continued, the Lord humbled and emptied himself "even unto death" on the Cross. It was a "choosing of littleness so that they glory of God might be manifest," he said.

From the pierced Heart of Christ Crucified, "blood and water" came forth. "This is the mystery of Christ," which we celebrate today, the pope explained: a "heart that loves, that chooses, that is faithful," and that "bind himself to us, reveals himself to the little ones, calls the little ones, makes himself little":

"We believe in God, yes, yes, and in Jesus, yes ... 'Is Jesus God?' — 'Yes'. But this is the mystery. This is the manifestation. This is the glory of God. Faithfulness in choosing, in binding himself and in littleness even for himself: becoming small, emptying himself. The problem of faith is the heart and core of our lives: we can be very, very virtuous but with little or no faith. We must begin here, with the mystery of Jesus Christ who has saved us by his faithfulness."

Pope Francis concluded, praying that the Lord might grant us the grace of celebrating, on this Solemnity of the Heart of Christ, "the great act, the great work of salvation, the great work of Redemption."

Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time. **Baptisms:** by appointment. **Marriages:** six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made. **Funerals and Memorials:** by appointment. **Holy Unction** (Anointing of the Sick): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing or to **meet with parish priest, please call or email Fr. Pavlo in advance to arrange a time and a day.**

***Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion:** 1) You are a member of the Catholic Church (Orthodox faithful are welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. **If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.**

Bequests and Wills: Leaving a bequest is a process of giving a donation through your will. It is simply a distribution from your estate to a charitable organization through your last will and testament. It can be as small or as large a donation as you wish. It is important that you talk to your lawyer about the process. In your kindness please remember The Most Holy Trinity Ukrainian Catholic Church in Kamloops, BC in your bequests and wills.
