Praznyk Liturgical Guidelines

- The Bishop is greeted in front of the church (at the door) with bread & salt and with flowers.
- Pastor presents Bishop with a hand cross for the procession into the church. After greeting (still at the doors):

Pastor: May the Lord bless you from Zion, and may you know Jerusalem's blessings all the days of your life, always, now, and forever.

All: Amen. Blessed be the name of the Lord, always, now and forever.

[The Bishop taking the Trikirion & Dikirion (in the sanctuary before the Divine Liturgy):

Bishop: O Lord, Lord, ... All: Mnohaya Lita, Lita. Многая літа.]

Troparion, Tone 8: You came down from on high, O Merciful One,* and accepted three days of burial* to free us from our sufferings.* O Lord, our life and our resurrection,* glory be to You!

Troparion, Tone 4: Clothed as in purple and fine linen* with the blood of Your martyrs throughout the world,* Your Church cries out to You through them, O Christ God:* send down Your loving kindness on Your people;* grant peace to Your community,* and to our souls great mercy.

+Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion, Tone 8: O Lord, Master of nature, * the world offers You the godly martyrs as the first-fruits of nature.* By their supplications, through the Mother of God,* preserve Your Church and Your people in profound peace,* O most merciful One.

The Trisagion

After second "Holy God", clergy sing: "Hagios ho Theos, hagios iskhiros, hagios athanatos, eleison himas".

- **Priest**: Give glory to Christ, our God! *** Віддайте славу Христу Богові нашому!
- **All:** continue the Trisagion with "Glory be to the Father...

Prokeimenon, Tone 8 - Pray and give thanks to the Lord our God.

verse: In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel. (Psalm 76:12,2)



Epistle: Hebrews 11:33-12:2

Brothers and Sisters, it is the saints who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut

the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented - of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground. Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect. Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Alleluia, Tone 4: The just cried out and the Lord heard them, and delivered them out of their afflictions.

verse: The afflictions of the just are many, and out of them all will the Lord deliver them. (Psalm 33:18,20)

Gospel: Matthew 10:32-33, 37-38; 19:27-30

At that time, the Lord said, "Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven; but whoever denies me before others, I also will deny before my Father in heaven. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me." Then Peter said in reply, "Look, we have left everything and

followed you. What then will we have?" Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, at the renewal of all things, when the Son of Man is seated on the throne of his glory, you who have followed me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or fields, for my name's sake, will receive a hundredfold, and will inherit eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."

After the Gospel reading:

All: Glory be to You, O Lord, glory be to You. *The Bishop will bless the faithful with candles and all sing the "Mnohaya Lita".*

After Great Entrance

Bishop will bless the faithful with candles and all sing "Mnohaya Lita."

Anaphora

After: "The mercy of peace, the sacrifice of praise", the Bishop blesses with the candles. **NO** "Mnohaya Lita" at this point.

Communion Hymn - Praise the Lord from the heavens;* praise Him in the highest. .

Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; * praise befits the righteous. Alleluia (3x).

Thanksgiving Hymn

After Holy Communion the Bishop blesses the people with the chalice saying: "Save Your people..."

All respond: Na Mnohaya Lita, Vladyko, OR may God grant You many years Bishop Ken. "We have seen the true light..."

Pastoral Ministry and Sacraments:

Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Divine Liturgies and other days, by appointment.

Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time.

Baptisms: by appointment.

Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made.

Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick (Holy Unction): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization or treatments and who would like to receive anointing or to meet with parish priest, please call or email Fr. Andrzej in advance to arrange a time and a day.

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion:

1. You are a member of the Catholic Church (Orthodox faithful are welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace.

If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.




CAMP ST. VOLODYMYR **** August 19-26, 2018
