The Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great is celebrated today

Troparion, Tone 1: Though the stone was sealed by the Judeans, * and soldiers guarded Your most pure body, * You arose, O Saviour, on the third day, * and gave life to the world. * And so the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of Life: * Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ! * Glory to Your kingdom! * Glory to Your saving plan, * O only Lover of mankind.

Troparion, Tone 4: Today is the crown of our salvation, * and the unfolding of the eternal mystery; * the Son of God becomes the Virgin's Son, * and Gabriel brings the good tidings of grace. * With him let us also cry to the Mother of God: * Rejoice, Full of grace! The Lord is with you.

Troparion, Tone 4: Princes of the heavenly hosts, * we, though unworthy, beg you to encircle us through your prayers* under the shelter of the wings of your spiritual glory.* Guard us as we come to you and sincerely cry: * "Deliver us from dangers, * O princes of the powers on high!"

Kontakion, Tone 1: You arose in glory from the tomb * and with Yourself You raised the world. * All humanity acclaims You as God, * and death has vanished. * Adam exults, O Master, * and Eve, redeemed now from bondage, cries out for joy: * "You are the One, O Christ, Who offer resurrection to all."

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion, Tone 2: Princes of God's hosts, ministers of divine glory,* leaders of angels and guides of men,* pray for our welfare and for great mercy, * O princes of the incorporeal powers.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion, Tone 8: To You, O Mother of God, * the invincible leader, * we, your servants, ascribe these victory hymns * in thanksgiving for our deliverance from evil. * With your invincible power free us from all dangers * that we may cry out to you: * Hail, O Bride and pure Virgin!

Prokeimenon, Tone 1-Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You.

verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous.

Prokeimenon, Tone 4 - He makes spirits His angels and flaming fire His ministers.

Epistle: Hebrews 9:11-14 (NRSV)

Brothers and sisters, when Christ came as a high priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation), he entered once and for all into the Holy Place, not with the blood of goats and calves, but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls, with the sprinkling of the ashes of a heifer, sanctifies those who have been defiled so that their flesh is purified, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to worship the living God!

Alleluia, Tone 1- God gives me vindication, and has subdued peoples under me.

Gospel: Mark 10:32-45 (NRSV);

At that time, Jesus took the twelve aside again and began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death; then they will hand him over to the Gentiles; they will mock him, and spit upon him, and flog him, and kill him; and after three days he will rise again." James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for

us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Hymn to the Mother of God - In you, O Full of Grace, all creation rejoices: the angelic ranks and all the human race. Sanctified temple and spiritual paradise, virgins' pride and boast, from whom God is made flesh and became a little Child; and He who is our God before all ages, He made your womb a throne, and He made it wider than all the heavens. CATECHETICAL SUMMARY

In both the Gospel and Epistle today, we learn about one of the hallmarks of Christianity – servant leadership. "Cleanse your conscience from dead works," Saint Paul teaches us, "to serve the living God."

And again, in the Gospel, Jesus explains that he did "not come to be served, but to serve." In this way of service, Jesus shows us that we are called to "give" our life to God through the gift of service to each other. During the Lenten season, the Church invites us to intensify our calling as servant leaders and to live out this calling in real, tangible ways.

The Annunciation to the Virgin Mary

184 The Lord God chose the Virgin Mary from Nazareth and through the Archangel Gabriel he announced to her that she would become the mother of the Son of God: "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the

Most High" (*Lk* 1:31-32, rsv-ce). Giving her consent—"I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word" (*Lk* 1:38, rsv-ce)—Mary offers herself to God, and the Holy Spirit descends upon her, and the power of the Most High overshadows her (see *Lk* 1:35). "We confess the holy Virgin to be Mother of God [*Theotokos*]; because God the Word was incarnate and became human."

185 Comparing Mary with Eve, Church tradition highlights the obedience of the Virgin Mary in contrast with the disobedience of our fore-mother Eve. Eve is the mother of all the living; Mary (the new Eve) is the Mother of the Source of life. Eve lost life (dying in death); Mary accepted and offered the Life, who in the Resurrection overcame death. Eve listened to the serpent and lost Paradise for humankind; Mary listened to God and returned Paradise in Christ. Adam was before Eve, but Mary, the New Eve, was before the New Adam, the Christ.

188 The liturgical tradition of the Church magnifies the most holy, most pure, most blessed and glorious Lady and God-bearing One as being "more honourable than the cherubim and more glorious than the seraphim." The cherubim are the highest angelic order. The Church extols her "holy birth ... and her immaculate conception." By her purity and her being immaculate the Theotokos surpasses all visible and invisible creation. Nonetheless, at the same time, she belongs to the human race spread forth from Adam and gathered in the Son of God. By conception without seed within the womb of the most holy Mother of God, the Son of God "receives into his bosom the old creation" and "manifests a new birth." All of this is accomplished by the goodwill of God and the assent of the Virgin Mary. "Christ Our Pascha" – Catechism of the Ukrainian Catholic Church, pg. 67-9

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion:

You are a member of the Catholic Church (Orthodox faithful are welcome to receive Holy Communion); 2) You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; 3) You attend Divine Services regularly; 4) Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; 5) You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). 6) You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. 7) To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace.

If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing.

Pastoral Ministry and Sacraments:

Reconciliation: on Sundays and Holy Days: before Divine Liturgies and other days, by appointment.

Holy Communion: for the sick, by appointment, any time.

Baptisms: by appointment.

Marriages: six months' notice should be given to the parish priest, and he should be contacted before any other arrangements are made.

Funerals and Memorials: by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick (Holy Unction): Those anticipating surgery, hospitalization, or treatments, and who would like to receive anointing, or to meet with the parish priest, please call, or email Fr. Andrzej in advance to arrange a time and a day.
